



Nomination Request for Environmental Educator of the Year Awards

New Hampshire Environmental Educators (NHEE) is seeking nominations for three annual awards recognizing New Hampshire's outstanding environmental educators. To learn more about NHEE visit www.nhee.org

The awards are open to all full-time New Hampshire public and private school teachers employed in grades K-12, college or graduate school and non-formal educators working in New Hampshire. Runners-up from previous years are eligible and encouraged to apply. Awards are presented in elementary (K-6), middle/secondary school (7-12), and non-formal/higher education categories.

Winning educators will each receive a \$200 cash award and a one-year membership in New Hampshire Environmental Educators. Recognition of the winners will occur at the NHEE Annual Conference in March.

Applications may be submitted either by an educator on his/her own behalf or by a colleague, supervisor, or student. **Submissions (in hard copy or electronic versions) must be sent by February 1, 2010.** A selection committee will choose the finalists from each category by reviewing completed applications.

To enter, fill out the form below and include a letter describing how the nominee's teaching fits the following criteria:

- engages students (youth or adults) in active examination of environmental topics/issues
- promotes individual and social responsibility in the use of natural resources
- encourages student involvement and action to bring about positive change for the environment
- uses creative and innovative approaches to EE programming
- if appropriate, connects student learning about the environment with the NH State Curriculum Frameworks or NAAEE Guidelines for Excellence

We are especially receptive to nominations of practitioners who:

- make connections between learners and their community
- create programs that take the practitioner outside her/his usual practice
- are involved in programs that represent advances in new and innovative practice of EE
- develop programs that can be a model for others

The letter should be no more than two pages long, in 12 point type with .75" margins. Supporting materials are welcome. And may be returned if requested and return postage is provided.
